 - Declaration of Unity: *“This we owe to AA’s future: to place our common welfare first; to keep our Fellowship united. For on AA unity depend our lives and the lives of those to come.”*
 - GSR Preamble: *“We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communication for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of AA. We realize the ultimate authority is a loving God as he may express himself in our Group Conscience. As trusted servants, our job is to bring information to our Groups, in order that they may reach an informed Group Conscience. In passing along the Group Conscience, we are helping to maintain the unity and strength so vital to our fellowship. Let us, therefore, have: the patience and tolerance to listen while others share; the courage to speak up when we have something to share; and the wisdom to do what is right for our Group and AA as a whole.”*
 - Tradition 9: (LONG FORM): *“Each AA group needs the least possible organization. Rotating leadership is the best. The small group may elect its secretary, the large group its rotating committee, and the groups of a large metropolitan area their central or intergroup committee, which often employs a full-time secretary. The trustees of the General Service Board are, in effect, our AA General Service Committee. They are the custodians of our AA Tradition and the receivers of voluntary AA contributions by which we maintain our AA General Service Office at New York. They are authorized by the groups to handle our overall public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principal newspaper, the AA Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in AA are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.”*
 - Concept 9: (LONG FORM) *“Good service leaders, together with sound and appropriate methods of choosing them, are at all levels indispensable for our future functioning and safety. The primary world service leadership once exercised by the founders of AA must necessarily be assumed by the Trustees of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.”*
